ALL Lions have been told that they must not accept verbal rental requests and that ALL request must be processed through the website <u>rentals@mayneislandlions.org</u>. In enforcing this policy, our aim is to avoid disappointment by Islanders assuming that a conversation with a Lion, means that the rental is registered. Each rental request involves between 3 and often as many as 10 Lions volunteers and can only be initiated by a request via the Website.
